In 2019, with your support and partnership, we served over 350 developmentally disabled and vulnerable adults age 18 years and older. Thank you for your courage, commitment, and support to enable us to do this. 2019 has been a good year for Edwards Center. We had good financial stability, added additional homes and completed a monumental employment transformation. If the truth were known, I am ready to put change and transformation on hold for awhile. I just want to take some deep breaths and focus on the infrastructure of our organization.

With so much constant change and so many new employees, we have been in a constant change mode now for two years. When that happens, an organization can get into a “getting by” mode, instead of digging deep for excellence. The Employment Program and Community Living Program transformation mandates have put high stress on our company to meet challenging transformation goals and numbers. I don’t want our goal to be about numbers and hours in the community, rather to focus on the quality of life for each participant individually. I want all Edwards Center Staff to understand on a deep level what the Gold Standard really looks like when lived out at every level of our organization.

2019 marks Edwards Center’s 48th anniversary since incorporation (50 years if you count the two years we operated before incorporation). During those eventful years, our organization has worked tirelessly to provide quality homes, work opportunities, education and recreational experiences to those with developmental disabilities. I am so proud of all we have accomplished in those years. However, our ability to continue to provide and improve these services is more seriously threatened right now than at any time during our existence. Increasingly, we find that government mandates take away dollars rather than increase them.

So, here’s my pitch! We need increasing support from individuals like you, who share our vision and are prepared to stand up for the values of quality of life and community participation for all those we serve. We simply cannot continue to be the best, let alone expand our reach, without substantial support from people like you. If you believe in the importance of our mission and feel that the effects of our work are worthy, I hope you will continue to support our efforts.

## A SALUTE TO GEORGIA LAMPROS

Georgia was a key part of providing paychecks to hundreds of people with disabilities so that they could work in a safe and happy workplace. She and her staff did this successfully with the help of 75 local businesses who were willing to support our mission and who needed offsite labor. Comcast, Bonita Pioneer, Canary Marketing, Parlor Puzzles, and Textronix are just a few of the many community partners we worked with.

*“Some of the happiest moments of my life have been spent at Edwards Enterprises, working and laughing with our participants and staff. Being able to help create jobs, paychecks, and friendships through work has been very gratifying,”* says Georgia. Georgia used her passion for our mission, her expert marketing skills, and endless enthusiasm to create jobs, work crews and in-house sub-contract work for Edwards Enterprises.

While Georgia will continue to provide marketing services part-time for the Community Employment Program, she will spend the balance of her time focusing on Fund Development. The closure of the workshop marks a big transition in her career.





# EXECUTIVE LEADER REPORT

What a year! If there's a word to describe 2019 at Edwards Center, it's "Transition." All of our core programs experienced significant transition this year. The headliner, of course, is Employment Services and our legacy business, Edwards Enterprises. For nearly fifty years we've supported people in an environment that was educational, productive and safe. People learned soft workplace skills like attendance, punctuality, appropriate workplace attire and acceptable workplace behavior. They also learned technical skills, like the operation of various types of machinery and the use of production equipment. People developed real, applicable skillsets that allowed them to be productive and contribute to the success of the companies that contracted with Edwards Enterprises.



State statutes and federal funding models required that our team transform the model that had been so successful for so many decades into a community-based model, where the people we serve would have opportunities to work in a more inclusive environment with people who aren't paid to support them. After more than two years of hard work toward this end, on December 31st of 2019 our sheltered workshop officially closed. We got together for a party that final day, wherein we celebrated our successes, mourned our losses and committed to a bright future for the people we serve and the staff that support them. We're grateful for all those who helped along the way, including supported workers, devoted staff, families and businesses that blazed the trail that would help others in the business community become more open-minded about the benefits people with disabilities could bring to their workplaces.

The same series of statutes and funding models that changed our employment programs also affect our day services. State statutes now require that most of the services provided through ECM and Aloha occur in a community setting. We're working with participants, along with their families and home providers to ensure the services we offer meet people's individual goals and interests. For Edwards Center and our team, our focus has always been and will remain serving people according to their choices and preferences.

Finally, our homes are not untouched by all the transformation. We're adapting our staffing patterns to ensure our residents have opportunities to participate in community-based jobs and outings. Much of the transportation our residents require is coming from and through our residential programs. We're so grateful for our teams' resilience and flexibility!

On a state level, all this transformation has resulted in a number of industry providers dropping several service elements. No doubt, they did what they felt was necessary for their agencies. As the still-new Executive Leader at Edwards Center, I'm deeply grateful for a Board of Directors that remains committed to our mission and the people we serve. I'm grateful for their history of responsible financial management that led to our ability to "ride out the storm." All of our team members remain resolute in our commitment to help the people we serve reach their highest potential.

## STEWARDS OF OUR COMPANY ASSETS

All donors are interested in how non-profits steward their assets, and that is no different here at Edwards Center. We are proud of the procedures we have in place to ensure our donors are comfortable with how we protect their giving.

At the helm of our Finance and Accounting Department is **Kathy Autrey** who has been with Edwards Center for 27 years. In 1992, Kathy left a comfortable job as controller at a large hotel in Eastern British Columbia, returning with her five-year-old daughter to Portland and to her family roots. Kathy came to Edwards Center during a time of great growth and change and has always met the challenge of moving us forward - for example, with implementing new computer systems and operational supports and putting best practices and procedures into operation.



Kathy takes seriously her stewardship of everything financial. *"Our system takes exceptional oversight, with built-in controls at every level to insure there is no misuse of funds,"* says Kathy. To that end, Kathy and her team are diligent about requisitions, support documentation and providing constant oversight. Every transaction has a clear audit trail. Kathy, along with the board finance committee, board treasurer and executive leader, are charged with contract negotiating, lease reviews, tax filing, bill paying, property acquisitions, record archiving and client finances. Kathy's reputation is legendary for consistently keeping records that are indisputably accurate.

Outside her work at Edwards Center, Kathy is passionate about tennis. With a USTA ranking of 4.0 (professionals rank 7 and most recreational tournament players around 3), Kathy competes in senior women's doubles, mixed doubles and singles. Kathy has taken this passion and shared it with our participants - teaching tennis in the spring and summer through our recreational catalog program.

Since Kathy began at Edwards Center, she has seen the annual budget increase fivefold; she has gained two assistants who help share the workload. We hired **Jeff Tondreau** in 1998. Jeff's career at Edwards Center is grounded in his early experience as residential and vocational direct care staff in the early '90's. After gaining a college accounting degree, Jeff transferred to our Accounting Department in 1998. *"I love my job,"* Jeff says. *"Because of my earlier work experience with Edwards Center, I feel my work is not just abstract numbers; I put real faces and programs to the figures."* Outside the Accounting Department, Jeff oversees some classes and outings for our participants on weekends. Among the participants favorite outings are his clamming trips with clam chowder feed afterward, and his fishing classes and river outings.

By 2014 our accounting workload had grown so significantly that another accounting specialist was added to Kathy Autrey's team. **Sabina Struk** has a master's degree in Accounting and Finance and came to us after working in accounting in both Ireland and her homeland, Poland. Sabina enjoys being able to support the passionate staff that do the direct care of individuals we serve. She is proud to be a part of the support team that makes it possible for Edwards to do the important work we do. *"Working under Kathy Autrey's wings is a big privilege for me. She is a wonderful leader and mentor for me. She is an amazing woman that shows determination and true professionalism,"* says Sabina.

While Edwards Center has strong internal financial controls, oversight, and reporting, we also have a formal Financial Review/Audit every year. An independent certified public accounting firm is engaged by the Board of Directors to perform these functions. Results of the Review/Audit are presented to our Senior Leadership group, the Finance Committee and the Board of Directors.

## WE MET OUR MATCH

At this year's annual luncheon, the Minson Family offered to match all donations up to \$100,000, and what a great success that was! Their family shares our belief that community inclusion is essential to *"Live Happy."* In the upcoming year, it's our goal continue to expand existing community inclusion programs and also develop new experiences for participants. This donation helps make that possible.

Becky Minson has been a long-time participant in Edwards Center's Community Living Program; she especially enjoys the art and music community outings. We loved seeing Becky's face light up after creating her own watercolor painting which was eventually displayed at the gallery exhibit showcased to the public in December. We are grateful for her siblings, Doug, Sue and Janet Minson's longtime commitment of support to Edwards Center.





# TREASURER REPORT

With preparing this annual report, comes the opportunity to look back and fully understand just how far we've come and how much we've accomplished throughout the year. Edwards Center continues to enjoy a strong financial position; we understand the importance of a strong capital budget and have an eye on the "Gold Standard" for all our homes as well. In other words, we are reinvesting in our future.



Over the last few years and especially in the months ahead, our employment and activities centers have been federally mandated to change, which continues to have an influence on the funding model and the services we offer. However, with the support of our friends, families and staff, we have made great strides to lessen that burden and the impacts of those mandates, while improving our community placements and community involvement for all our clients. The Board continues to put a high priority on being ready for whatever challenges still lay ahead.

Fundraising year to date continues to be very strong and has helped to make it possible to continue to add, replace, or upgrade our homes, striving for that "Gold Standard." Our financial reserves remain strong and the Board will continue to monitor that for any negative impacts, making quick and decisive adjustments as needed.

The Edwards Center, as I've said, remains financially strong and does not take your trust, or your support lightly. The Edwards Center Board will continue being financially responsible and as always, very grateful to everyone for the trust and support we receive.

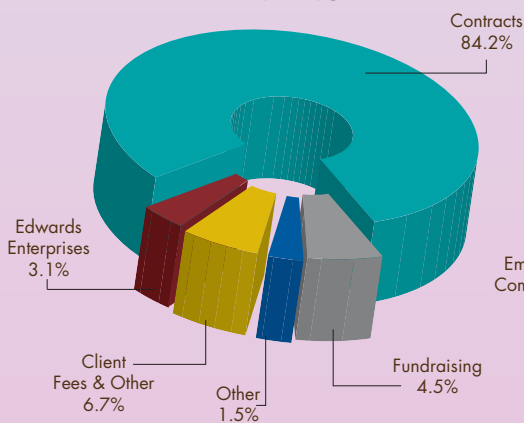

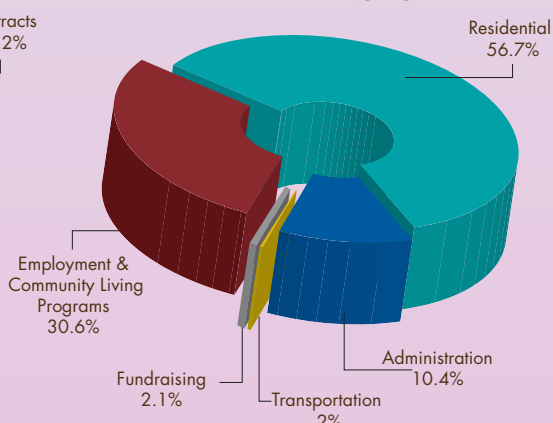
